Well, let's start at the beginning. On Sunday, July 18th, we hosted the third annual all-day FLAGS/CLTA International Interactive Games Exhibit created by Nicole Naditz for the State Fair. Once again, families, as well as students and teachers, visited our booth to play games, talk about language learning, take the "Are you smarter than a language teacher" quiz, and spin the wheel for Discover Languages prizes. On Friday, August 27th, from 4:30 to 6:00 PM, FLAGS held our Fall Festa at Buca di Beppo in Sacramento. World Language teachers gathered to enjoy the delicious Italian fare and to talk about teaching – of all things – World Languages. The event was free to FLAGS members, and Cindy Peiper was the lucky winner of a \$50 gift certificate to Teachers' Discovery.

Unfortunately our fall workshop was cancelled due to lack of interest, so we'll be looking to see what suits you better. Look for our winter workshop January 29, 2011.

Apart from these workshops, **Read Around the World** is back!. FLAGS has partnered with the various branches of the Sacramento Public Library since 2005 to enable teachers to offer their students an authentic opportunity to practice their reading and speaking skills in front of a real audience. This event also gives you as a teacher a forum to advocate for your program: participation gives you an opportunity to make your language program visible in the community. There is no financial cost to participate; time and enthusiasm are the only requirements. There will be a mandatory orientation for teachers new to this program, and in addition, FLAGS will be offering grants to participating FLAGS members to buy supplies and/or books.

But we're not done yet! The Sacramento County Fair will again be welcoming World Language Projects at the end of May, 2011. FLAGS will be providing mini-grants to participating current FLAGS members to pay the \$2.00 fee for up to ten student entries, for a total of \$20. We will be letting you know the deadline to submit forms and payment to enter student work, as well as the date to drop off and pick up student work as the date gets closer.

And let's not forget that we are looking forward to seeing old and new members at the 2011 California Language Teachers' Association Conference, to be held in Santa Clara from March 17th–20th. Consider presenting a one-hour interest session or

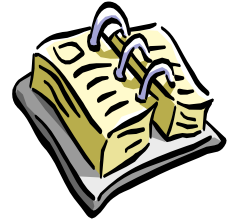

Once again, FLAGS members and their students showed up in force to man the "Discover Languages" booth at the California State Fair in July. Student volunteers from Bella Vista and Natomas High Schools played children's games from around the world with the fair guests. The games came from China, Germany, India, Mozambique, the Puma Indians, Iceland, and other countries. This provided interesting opportunities to highlight the diversity of world cultures in a very fun way.

Teacher volunteers ran the prize wheel (to give away Discover Languages merchandise) and talked about the importance of language proficiency to our society. This one-day event at the State Fair gives us a great

opportunity to talk to the public about the benefits of language study.

Next year, we will lengthen the volunteer shifts so that we need fewer student volunteers and FLAGS will provide fair admission tickets to student volunteers as well as adults. Students will still be responsible for parking, if they choose to park there (many park elsewhere and take a shuttle or walk). STUDENT'S LANGUAGE PROJECT AWARDED "BEST IN SHOW" AT COUNTY FAIR

Erin McKey, a 2010 graduate of Center High School, won the highest honor any language student has received for her world language submission to the Sacramento County Fair in May.

McKey, a student of Tanya Zaccone (Spanish Teacher, Center High School and FLAGS Board Member), created an original journal of a "trip" from Sacramento to Machu Picchu. Her journal included nine entries entirely in Spanish about the trip, "mementos" of the trip, a menu she created from a Peruvian restaurant, and a letter about the trip to her Spanish 1 teacher.

Once her entry was judged as "Best in Class" for the world language project category, it was automatically moved on for judging for "Best in Show" for youth exhibits. Although "Best in Class" is selected by our volunteer judges who are language teachers, "Best in Show" is selected by fair volunteers, none of whom are language teachers.

This year, for the first time, our category's submission for "Best in Class" also won "Best in Show," a testament to the outstanding level of proficiency this student possesses and also to Tanya's exemplary teaching practice.

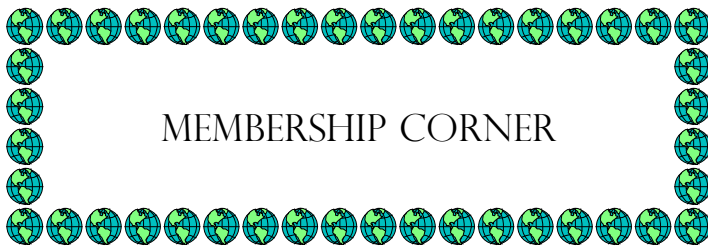

CLTA Celebrates 40 Years at March 2010 Conference

During the weekend of March 12-14, 2010, CLTA celebrated its 40th anniversary at the annual conference in San Diego. In addition to the regularly anticipated workshops and interest sessions, attendees had a chance to remember the many leaders who contributed to building the present-day professional association that serves language educators around the state today.

There were several changes in the conference format this year to respond to the challenge of finding funding to attend the conference. In an effort to provide more opportunities for local teachers to attend workshops even though they may not be able to get funding for a substitute, CLTA scheduled workshops late on Friday evening. Another way to reduce costs for participants was to eliminate the banquet on Friday evening and continental breakfast on Saturday morning. The government grant awards were announced during the lunch on Saturday and the Outstanding Teacher awards were presented during the Sunday brunch which rounded out the conference.

At the Plenary session on Saturday, conference attendees heard from Joe Nuñez, Director of Governmental Relations for the California Teachers Association. He gave us an update on the state of educational affairs in the state, confirming what many of us already know: we are facing difficult times ahead. He also encouraged us to be advocates for our students and classes.

On Saturday evening, CLTA hosted a 40th birthday bash to celebrate the 40 years of CLTA's existence. ACIS sponsored appetizers and attendees heard from the wife of Hal Wingard, CLTA's first Executive Director who passed away last year. There was a photo show of pictures from past CLTA conferences, and Treasurer Sue McKee had saved all of the past conference programs and had them on display, bringing back lots of memories. Attendees could also participate in a CLTA trivia quiz to test their knowledge of CLTA history. The winner of the competition was announced at the Sunday brunch, and as an extra surprise, the winner was Christine Lanphere from FLAGS!

FLAGS was well represented at the conference with presentations by Ruth Ward, Nicole Naditz, Christine Lanphere, and Cindy Peiper. Next year's conference will be held March 17-20, 2011, in Santa Clara which makes it really accessible to us in Sacramento. FLAGS to Offer Small Grants to Teachers

In our ongoing effort to increase benefit to our members, the FLAGS Board has approved the creation of two small grants to help FLAGS members (and their students) participate in community-based language activities.

The first grant is designed to help teachers participate in *Read Around the World*, a program in which language students (and those who speak a language other than English at home) select a children's story to read during a special story hour at their local public library. Teachers help the students select a story that will be engaging, develop a fun pre-reading activity to get the young audience excited and prepared for the story, use props such as puppets or felt board while telling the story, and create a fun "take-away" item, such as a coloring page related to the story. In essence, the students use the same strategies that we use as teachers to make the story fun and accessible to their young audience.



The small grant for *Read Around the World* is designed to provide some financial assistance to teachers who need to purchase some more children's books or to purchase supplies for use during the event, such as poster paper, felt board, etc. The grant amount is \$50 and will be paid as a reimbursement to teachers after they do all of the following:

1. Complete the online application (available at the FLAGS Web site: <http://www.flagsteacher.com>)
2. Attend a training event about *Read Around the World* with the program organizer, Nicole Naditz (teachers who participated in *Read Around the World* in a previous year are exempt from this requirement)
3. Provide Nicole with the date, time, and

library branch location during which the *Read Around the World* session will take place

4. Keep and submit receipts for purchases being submitted for reimbursement up to the maximum amount of \$50
5. Submit photographic or video proof that the Read Around the World event took place as scheduled at the public library branch the teacher selected. Please note that we may use the photos and/or video in future publicity about this program. The information packet you will receive includes a photo/video release form that must be completed by all participating students and signed by their parents.

The second small grant will defray the costs of entering student work in the **Sacramento County Fair** by reimbursing teachers for the per-student entry fee for up to 10 students (currently \$2 per student). Please note the following:

1. Teachers must complete the online grant application for this grant in order to be eligible.
2. We will only reimburse for entries submitted by the deadline established by the Sacramento County Fair. This deadline will also be publicized on the FLAGS Web site once it is known. We will not reimburse late entries!
3. Teachers will be reimbursed **after** FLAGS receives confirmation from the county fair that their forms and payments have been received.
4. Teachers will still be responsible for dropping off projects the weekend before the fair and for attending the fair in order to pick up the projects on the last day of the fair at closing time (Memorial Day at 7:00 p.m.).

We hope that these two grant opportunities will encourage you to involve your students in these community-based activities. They are wonderful advocacy for your language programs.
