Sacramento FLAGS/CLTA Conference an Inspiring Success by Tanya Zaccone, Local Chair

Looking around the Conference this year, one couldn't help but notice the sea of blue ribbons on nametags, signifying a multitude of first-time CLTA Conference attendees, great news for the future of world language in California. More than 600 participants attended March 5-8, 2015 in Sacramento, eager to learn more about "Common Core and More: Big Ideas Start Here," from outstanding and engaging presenters. Attendees of Thursday and Friday workshops came away with cutting edge ideas to use right away, as well as current theories and ideas to consider for changing the culture of the classroom. As CLTA president Svetlana Lazarova said, the Conference could be a time "...to assess and reflect on the ever-changing dynamics of the learning environment – from teacher-centered to teacher-driven and student-centered, to now student-driven, or maybe, that nowadays young people need to be college- AND career-ready with the world language community adding world-ready."

The Conference was dedicated to **Sylvia Jones**, a long-time CLTA member, past president and Conference Chair. A tribute in Sylvia's honor brought complete silence and many tears to the attendees of the Friday night Banquet. As the former Executive Director of CLTA, **Lorraine D'Ambruoso**, noted in the Conference program:

Sylvia's life was devoted to the idea that education was a right and a necessity for each and every student. She was one of the first to work on fostering equity for all in our educational system. She was an inspiration and a mentor to teachers, young and old. For that reason, her husband, **Vernon** has established a fellowship in Sylvia's memory to support teachers' participation at Summer Seminar.

What a tribute to Sylvia! She would be happy to see the many educators continuing the tradition. And to that end, Conference also means awards and grants, and the coveted Hal Wingard Lifetime Achievement Award went to Anne Jensen, currently a teacher of French and Instructional Supervisor at Henry M. Gunn High School in Palo Alto. Carol Sparks was awarded the prestigious Lorraine D'Ambruoso Award for Meritorious Service to the Profession. CLTA President, Svetlana Lazarova, presented the President's Award to Kim Hoffman of Elkhorn Consulting Partners, who has donated much of her time to coaching CLTA in the use of Salesforce.
