

Summer Seminar, 2017

<u>Celebrate Success!</u>

Summer Seminar 2017 once again lived up to its name and reputation, as participants explored "Core Practices for World Language Learning and Global Competency" within their chosen strands, as well as during daily morning sessions with knowledgeable and entertaining speakers.

One highlight that hasn't changed over the years, is the introduction of the students in the Student Strand, which is an opportunity for college sophomores and juniors to explore the world language teaching profession in the context of supportive and knowledgeable professionals.

Our Annual CLTA Town Hall Meeting took a different turn this year, with a panel discussion surrounding the topic "Supporting All Student in our National Climate." Our panelists, Pat Nakashima, Nancy Pérez, Maricela Morales and Dany Doueiri, shared their personal and professional histories with the convening group, as a starting point for discussion and sharing what some schools and districts are currently doing to address this important concern.

If you have already been to Summer Seminar, you are no doubt already considering asking for funding for next July. As you think through your options, check with your school or district to find out if there are professional development funds available for this kind of an opportunity. Additionally, student teachers and new or beginning teachers (in their first three years of teaching), should also consider applying for a partial grant worth \$500. Teachers can use this grant it to reduce the amount of money they need to earn or raise to pay for the conference, and they get to attend the strand of their choice at the workshop.
