Member SPOTLIGHT and BEST practices

Tovah Skiles , a Spanish teacher in Davis, presented at our Spring PD on how she assesses presentational communication in her classroom. She started by defining presentational communication are rehearsed writing and speaking, which receives no immediate feedback. She talked about 8 different activities that she uses in her classroom. One activity, Tovah explained, is a project called "My tee-shirt". Students create a paper t-shirt which they would wear as if they were a camp counselor. Their tee-shirt has images that represent themselves. It is their visual tool as they verbally present themselves to others.

Tovah also introduced the group to the R.A.F.T technique for presentational writing. R.A.F.T. stands for Role, Audience, Format and Topic. Students can choose who they would like to be as a summative writing assignment. For example, in a climate crises assignment, they could chose to be a child, a polar bear, a glacier or a single use plastic product. Then they choose (from a list of possibilities) their audience, the format and the topic. She had so many great ideas. Provide feedback on the California World Languages Framework

An instructional framework is designed to accompany content standards and provide critical support to the subject area of the standards in the areas of equitable, high quality instruction; assessment; professional learning; and instructional materials. When our California World Languages Standards were adopted by the State Board of Education in January of 2019, that started the timeline for the development of our *California World Languages Framework*.

The Framework had an initial public review period at the end of 2019 and is now in its second and final public review period. The input of world languages educators like yourselves is critical to ensure that the final product represents the best thinking in the field and will be useful to teachers, administrators and publishers.

Please go to https://www.cde.ca.gov/ci/fl/cf/ to view the draft chapters and then send your feedback to https://www.cde.ca.gov/ci/fl/cf/ by 2 p.m. on March 30 so that your feedback can be considered by the Instructional Quality Commission (IQC) during their next meeting. Remember that the most useful feedback is precise and specific, including providing the exact page and line numbers about which you are writing and exactly what you want the IQC to consider or do.

FLAGS Spring PD Leap Into the Modes

What did you do to commemorate Leap Day this year? For this special day that only comes once every four years, local World Language teachers gathered in a classroom at Sacramento State. Those 25 FLAGS members had valuable training on the 3 modes of communication in languages.

Kristina Argueta, who teaches at Oak Ridge High School presented on how to assess <u>interpretive</u> <u>communication</u> with the new World Language Standards. She emphasized using authentic materials because they provide real-life examples of the language in every day use. The internet provides us with a huge amount of resources of authentic sources. She argues that you can find them on Twitter, Youtube, Facebook, and even train schedules. You can adjust the task to what your learners should be able to do. Kristina spoke about how to design a thematic IPA and reminded us about the differences between performance tasks and proficiency assessments. Performance tasks are ones that assess what learners can do on one day versus proficiency tasks which will demonstrate what a student can do at any time, inside or outside of class. One non-assessment activity she shared was the **"Tossed Salad Reading activity"**. During this activity, students are grouped to read a document. They have slips of paper of different colors - green, red, yellow, and orange. As students read, they interrupt each other with questions (green slips of paper), opinions (red slips of paper), connections (yellow slips of paper). When they interrupt the reader, they then take the responsibility to read. They have to make a salad during reading with all of the colors from the slips of paper.

Meadow Pritchett, a Bella Vista High School teacher, followed Kristina to share strategies for using <u>interpersonal communication</u> in the classroom. With interpersonal communication, meaning is actively negotiated between two speakers. With a document, you can make misinterpretations, but no one will tell you that you are wrong. But in interpersonal communication, you have conversation (in person, on the phone, or text messaging without the chance to perfect your language. Interpersonal communication is messy or awkward. "Students often dislike it because they are put on the spot and do not have moments to reflect", says Meadow. However, this is the heart of what we want them to be able to do. One novel idea that we loved was her activity for "Silent texting". Students are given white boards and must write messages back and forth to each other in the target language in silence. It can be any topic, such as "what are you going to do this weekend?" The activities practiced during the day were interactive and applicable to any classroom.
