Do you know Jean Girard? She teaches lower levels of French at Vista and Folsom High. Like many of us, she is always looking for ways to attract students and then encourage them to use the French that they learn in the classroom. Here, she describes a successful project that she has done for the past couple of years.

Jean: My French students exchange letters with students in France of the same age who are learning English. I have found this to be a fun and effective way to motivate my students to use French to communicate with a native speaker. I mostly use a physical exchange of letters by mail; a handwritten letter is more personal and students often include drawings. My students really look forward to receiving their pen pal letters. However, this year I also started using an application called Padlet to exchange short, simple messages more frequently. Luckily I was able to use Rotary Grant money to purchase the \$99 upgraded version which allows unlimited Padlets and larger files - the free version is limited to only 6 Padlets. If you are not familiar with Padlet, it is an application which allows you to create an online bulletin board which can be used to display many kinds of information (pictures, documents, messages, etc.). It is very easy to use and makes collaboration and organization simple since you can create an individual board for each topic and class.

I start by creating a Padlet for a particular topic and sharing the link with my students (you have the option of creating a password and approving items before posted). Students are given instructions on what they are required to post and I post an example to get them started. Students can post with a phone or computer. The link is also shared with the teacher in France so that her students can post on the same board. For one recent board, my students posted physical descriptions of themselves in French along with a picture of a celebrity that they looked like (I used a phone app to take a picture of the student and match them with someone). The French students also posted their descriptions with pictures, only in English. My students enjoyed reading what their classmates had posted and especially what the French students had written. The assignment was interesting and more motivating than just writing it on a piece of paper. This week my students are working on resolutions for the New Year which they will post and share with French students. It will be great fun to compare.

- New content standards were unanimously adopted by the State Board of Education on January 9th!!
- A committee of educators and other stakeholders throughout the state has been approved to support the work of the Framework writers, including our own Christine Lanphere. They will be drafting a new World Languages Framework for California schools.
- The Global 2030 Initiative (https://www.cde.ca.gov/eo/in/documents/globalca2030report.pdf) spearheaded by outgoing State Superintendent Tom Torlakson, has provided both a renewed lens and an increased focus on the critical role of a multilingual, intercultural society to support our state's societal and economic interests.

It is possible that there has never been a more invigorating and important time to be a language educator in California!

Check out this issue of the FLAGS Pole to know about upcoming opportunities to learn about our new World Languages Standards, see when you will be able to provide input on the drafts of the World Languages Framework, get to know one of our FLAGS members in the debut of what will be a recurring section highlighting our outstanding teachers, see how you can honor an amazing educator at your school, and more.

World Language updates

Several FLAGS members are heavily involved in important projects related to World Languages at the state level. We are thrilled and honored that you have chosen to serve the profession in this way. Since our last update in September, some important work has been accomplished in the area of world languages education in California.

- 1. Public comment on the draft standards was received and reviewed by the Instructional Quality Commission (IQC). The IQC is the primary advisory body to the State Board of Education.
- 2. After this review, including consideration of edits suggested by the public and by the IQC, the IQC unanimously approved the draft to be forwarded to the State Board of Education.
- 3. The State Board of Education unanimously approved the adoption of the draft standards, making them the new Content Standards for World Languages in California. Here is a line to the Standards: https://www.cde.ca.gov/be/st/ss/documents/wlstandards2.docx
- 4. The IQC also forwarded candidates for the Curriculum Frameworks and Evaluation Criteria Committee to the State Board of Education. They will now begin their work on a new World Languages Framework alongside the Framework Writers (with our own Christine Lanphere serving as chief writer).

So what's next? First of all, several opportunities are planned to help provide an introduction to the new standards:

- 1. There will be a double session at CLTA in San Jose March 2-3, 2019. Go the "conference" link on the CLTA website (https://clta.net/) for more information.
- 2. The FLAGS Spring Workshop on April 6, 2019 will also provide an introduction to the standards. More information will be posted on the website as it becomes available.
- 3. We anticipate future opportunities, such as upcoming programs by the Capital World Language Project and perhaps at the Santa Barbara Summer Seminar. We will be sharing information about any other opportunities to learn about the standards as they become available.
- 4. Your school and/or district may also have plans to support world language programs with professional learning around the new standards. If they need or want support in this area, they should contact the Capital World Language Project to make arrangements for members of their accomplished leadership team to facilitate professional learning and provide technical support in the implementation of the World Languages Content Standards. Remember that there will be opportunities to provide public comment on the draft framework in the near future. In fact, unlike content standards, curriculum frameworks benefit from two public comment periods. These will come later in 2019, but we will send a message to members when the time comes. On September 29, 2018, 16 FLAGS members gathered at CSUS for two presentations: "Connecting for Communication" and "Curating Student Portfolios." Deanna Duffy and Nicole Naditz shared some exciting programs that bring relevant technology into our language classrooms. Deanna demonstrated "Seesaw," a digital portfolio that collects students' digital and physical work in one place. Everything is organized, making assessment and conferences easier. Deanna particularly likes the program for the recording capability, plus built-in tools make it easy for students to capture their learning, reflect and develop new skills.

Nicole followed up with "FlipGrid," which also records video of our students talking. It allows for a threaded conversation that students can follow and respond to over days, weeks, or even months. The possibilities are exciting for overseas penpals: the different time zones don't matter, because when a penpal come online, he or she can respond to the students' comments. Our students can connect with another class of learners, with classes overseas, with content experts or even a Peace Corps volunteer. Once students have posted, the true power is in getting replies. . . engaging our students in a global community. The FLAGS members enjoyed themselves immensely as they logged on to FlipGrid to create their own posts and recordings.
