FLAGS Fall PD

On September 26th, FLAGS met for a Fall workshop via Zoom to learn about how to address the modes of communication during distance learning. Tovah Skiles taught us her best tricks to use Pear Deck for Interpretive communication. She demonstrated how the features of Pear Deck allow students to interact with text by drawing on slides, typing their answers to questions and dragging answers into different areas on the slides. These tools allow teachers to create engagement with text and to get accurate data of how students are interacting with the text. During the FLAGS PD, Tovah used an infographic that talked about the effects of climate change. Participants were asked to respond to that infographic. It was a poignant demonstration of how teachers can use Pear Deck as students interpret text and images.

Did you know you can make a virtual bingo game to play with your students? You put in the words and it will make 30 cards for free. You just give students the link and they get a unique card.

https://myfreebingocards.com/ bingo-card-generator/preview/ s3drgs Kristina Argueta presented a **fabulous activity for Interpersonal communication.** After practicing the past tense (and in French, the imperfect), students are asked to exchange information about a past event. "I tell them there was a burglary at school Saturday evening between 5-10 and the suspects are in our class." With a partner, students must create an alibi. They should say that they were with their partner the whole time and that they need lots of details to support an alibi. For example, they need to say not just where they went but also how much they spent, etc. "I don't give too many examples of details because I want there to be holes." Students have about 20 minutes in their groups to prepare. Then, one partner steps outside (or in this case into the waiting room) and the other partner tells us their alibi and the class asks questions for more details. When they get really into it, they ask everything--what color was the car, etc. The partners then switch places and the class looks for holes. The activity would continue until every pair is done and then the class could vote on who had the weakest alibi.

Capital World Language Project 2020-2021 Program Update

Days 1 and 2 of the CapWLP 2020-21 program have come and gone, but it's not too late to sign up for some timely professional development in 2021! This year's program is "*Teaching and Learning World Languages in Blended and Distance Learning*", and for the first time, you have the opportunity to either attend all 5 days of professional learning (and purchase CE units if you complete all required assignments), OR you can choose to attend individual days as you wish.

Days 3 and 4 are the stand-alone presentations which are available for individual sign up and attendance. Day 3 (February 6, 2021) will focus on maximizing synchronous learning time and summative assessment in all of the Modes of Communication. Day 4 (March 6, 2021) will deal with student engagement and differentiation. Both days will be facilitated by experienced CapWLP Team members. Each day is available at a daily registration fee of \$30.00. CapWLP can accept check or credit card payments.

Distance Learning Ideas and Tips



I reached out to Karina Fielden, a Spanish teacher in the San Juan Unified School District, and asked her to share some of her best Distance Learning tips. Here's what she has to share with us. Time-Saving Tips

It feels like during DL, time is more valuable than it has ever been! So, I have been working on trying tools and ideas that will allow me to save time whenever possible. One of my favorite tools is the Chrome extension Mote. This is an audio recording extension that works easily with Google Chrome. Instead of typing my feedback for each student, I provide oral feedback. Depending on the level, this feedback is either in English or our Target Language. The students actually love this! I feel it has allowed me to bring a bit of human touch into this environment and it allows me to connect with each kid.

Breakout Rooms

Regarding breakout rooms, I use them with my higher levels on Fridays and Mondays. On Fridays, students go into breakout rooms to talk about their plans for the weekend, on Mondays, they talk about what they did over the weekend. At the end of the breakout rooms, we all meet and I randomly choose students to tell me about what one person in their group shared. This practice allows them to interact, speak, and listen. They not only practice speaking about themselves but also about someone else.

Picture Tuesday

I show a picture (people at the park, kids playing, a couple arguing) at the beginning of class. Students describe what they think is happening in the picture. While everyone does this activity, I ask for volunteers to share their descriptions. Sometimes I use the chat to encourage them to volunteer so there's no dead time. This activity can be done in writing or verbally (recording). Sometimes the descriptions are so funny, we choose the best one as "La Mejor" (The best) and the kids love participating.
