California Rocks ACTFL 2014... Again!

Everyone knows everything is big in Texas, but at the ACTFL 2014 Convention in San Antonio on November 21, nothing was bigger than the anticipation among the California contingent. More than 20 CLTA members (including many from FLAGS) sat together at the Opening General Session (and many more were in the room of more than 3000 Convention attendees), eagerly awaiting the introduction of the five Regional Finalists for ACTFL National Language Teacher of the Year and the announcement of the 2015 TOY.

Representing CLTA and SWCOLT in the competition was Nicole Naditz, President of FLAGS. Nicole was required to prepare an extensive online portfolio highlighting her teaching philosophy and practices, analyzing samples of her students' work, and outlining her many professional activities, including professional presentations and advocacy. She also interiewed with the ACTFL

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Teacher of the Year Selection Committee, which included questions about her professional practice and a formal speech to an audience outside the language teaching profession on a topic of national language policy.

After each candidate was introduced, ACTFL President Mary Lynn Redmond dramatically opened the envelope and announced the name of the 2015 ACTFL National Language Teacher of the Year: Nicole Naditz! At that point, the California rows were on their feet and screaming. I was trying to capture a photo of the moment and then realized I was experiencing a localized earthquake. While expected for California, we were in Texas, so I looked around and saw, among others, CWLP Executive Director Duarte Silva jumping up and down in celebration. Apparently, it was happening up and down the row because observers sitting behind our colleagues at the other end of the row commented on the "earthquake"!

Nicole is California's third ACTFL TOY, along with myself (2007) and Yo Azama (2012). She is also the IOth ACTFL TOY, marking an important milestone for this amazing program which has honored 50 outstanding teacher leaders across the country. Many have gone on to important leadership roles in their states and regions.

As ACTFL 2015 Teacher of the Year, Nicole will be the national spokesperson for ACTFL on issues of language policy. She will travel to regional conferences (SWCOLT, SCOLT, and CSCTFL) to present on her teaching practice and will also attend the Language Advocacy Conference in Washington, D.C., in May, where she will have the opportunity to meet with California Congressional representatives to discuss language education policy.

FLAGS and CLTA are extremely proud of your many accomplishments, Nicole, and congratulations on becoming ACTFL 2015 National Language Teacher of the Year! We wish you a fantastic year.
