High school students conduct coast-to-coast interviews during 24-hour live webcast for Discover Languages Month

High school students in Fair Oaks and their teacher, Nicole Naditz put together a 24-hour marathon LIVE webcast about the benefits of language study in honor of Discover Languages Month. The entire webcast streamed live out of Naditz's classroom at Bella Vista High School from 9:00 a.m. Feb. 17 through 9:00 Feb. 18.

During the webcast, students conducted live interviews Naditz had arranged with prestigious authors, professors, politicians, business owners, the 2009 and 2010 National Language Teachers of the Year, community leaders and parents. Some interviews were live and others were conducted via Skype, an internet calling application. When they weren't conducting interviews, students hosted segments to share information about the benefits of language study—many of which included material submitted by students of fellow FLAGS members Christine Lanphere (Natomas High School); Vanessa Sosa, Evelyn Bejarano and Sarah Kapinski (Bella Vista High School); and Kristina Jenkins (Oak Ridge High School). The 2010 program will feature several films never seen before in Sacramento: a wonderful selection of classic French masterpieces by some of cinema's best directors of all time. It will also include a diverse collection of French and local Sacramento short films, as well as two midnight movies followed by coffee and pastries. The cost of single ticket admission to the festival is \$10; it is \$9 for students, seniors, members of the Sacramento Jewish Film Festival, Alliance Française, Club Français and Crocker Museum with ID or membership card. The cost is \$14 or \$13 on closing night, which includes the film and closing party. In addition to single tickets, various passes are available. After the Sacramento French Film Festival at the Crest Theatre, we can look forward to our third annual all-day FLAGS International Interactive Games Exhibit at the State Fair, created by our webmaster and advocacy chair, Nicole Naditz.
